

Pastor's Perspective: Why Get Married in Church?

When I served as vocation director, my primary goal was to find men whom God might be calling to the priesthood. I also had many conversations with people who were interested in Religious Life, and helped steer them in the right direction. However, the vocation that I had the most conversations about was marriage. This should come as no surprise. Even though priests, nuns and monks are sometimes seen as something like unicorns – as mythical creatures – and as a result create a lot of curious questions, marriage is the vocation most people are called into by God.

One of the challenges to seeing marriage as a vocation, and wanting to celebrate marriage as a sacrament in church, is that marriage is a natural vocation. It existed before Christianity because God created male and female, and the two of them shall become one flesh. Since marriage is not necessarily connected to a church (like Baptism would be), it is possible to view marriage as something other than a vocation or sacrament. It is possible to see it as the most perfect day of one's life, requiring the right clothes and decorations and invitations and venues and food and drink and dancing and photography and... Well, that could keep going.

Personally, I love weddings; I find them to be very joyful. However, when I prepare a couple for marriage, I spend very little time on the day compared to the life ahead of the soon to be married couple. While getting married in a church may not be as Instagramable as, say, a vineyard, it makes a statement that the couple will not be able to remain a couple without God's love binding them together, making of the two, one flesh.

It can be helpful for those who are married to share with those who are not the benefits of getting married in a church and of going through the marriage preparation. I've even had weddings where the couple had close family and friends at church one day, celebrated the sacrament, and then went to the vineyard the next for a bigger celebration. I'm fine with that! I just want to be sure that married couples live out their vocation with the benefit of the grace of this sacrament where "Christ abundantly blesses the love that binds you!"
