



From The Pastor

Throughout Lent, I focused a lot on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is one of our two sacraments of healing, and is a concrete way to encounter Jesus and his mercy for you. Today, as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we receive another reminder to turn to this sacrament in order to become free from the burden of sin. You can receive complete forgiveness in this powerful sacrament. Yet as powerful as it is, some additional healing may be necessary due to the deep hurt, trauma, or psychological conditioning (for example, convincing yourself that you are worthless because of what you did) that you experienced. As a result, our diocese has been introducing and developing several avenues of healing, including the following:

- **Unbound Prayer:** A ministry of healing in which a trained prayer team prays with individuals to assist them in overcoming the spiritual obstacles they encounter in their path of Christian discipleship—often rooted in trauma or woundedness—and take hold of greater freedom in Christ.
- **Trauma Reboot:** a Christ-centered, peer-led process that helps people recover from trauma in a variety of contexts: combat, first responders, the pandemic, abuse, and more.
- **Project Rachel:** a Catholic approach to spiritual and psychological healing for those women and men who have been chosen abortion. Psychological support is free, and spiritual support is sensitive and specifically trained to minister to those who have lived through an abortion.
- **Catholic in Recovery:** as addictions of all types rise in a suffering culture, Catholic in Recovery seeks to supplement the recovery work done in 12 step groups with sacramental grace and classic spiritual wisdom from the masters.

As you turn to Jesus in his Divine Mercy, let yourself be reconciled. If you discover that you still have wounds remaining, the above opportunities may be helpful tools to help you move closer to the freedom of the children of God that you have been called into. Blessings to you throughout this Easter season, and may the light of Christ shine brightly in your life!
