

The faithful of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester will continue to be dispensed from their Sunday obligation for the duration of time that public Masses are suspended. Adoration will also be suspended. You are encouraged to view the weekly **TV Mass**, broadcast Sundays at 7:30 a.m. on KIMT Channel 3-Rochester/Mason City and WLAX Channel 25-La Crosse, and at 9:00 a.m. on MyTV 3.2. **Fr. Frerichs is also recording the Sunday Mass** each week at St. Rose, and it will be posted on our website, www.st-rose.org.
