

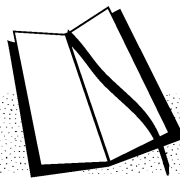

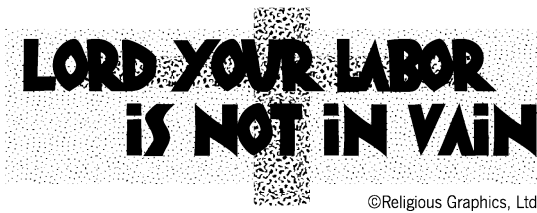

Faith Formation Update

Faith Formation continues to go well for our just over 100 students. We are now over halfway through the year and it feels like we are moving into the home stretch with many events and sacraments happening this spring.

Each of the elementary grades 1 – 6 complete a learning center throughout the year. The fourth graders were able to help assist with many of the ministries during Mass on February 13th when they had their center.

The second graders have completed their preparation for First Reconciliation and have now moved on to preparing for their First Communion. XZ Gernes received his First Communion on February 12th at Immaculate Conception. The other students will receive First Communion on May 1st here at St Rose.

The 3rd graders have their learning center coming up on March 20th.

Confirmation students are continuing their preparations in the classroom as well as actively meeting with their sponsors. Confirmation will once again be held at the Cathedral in Winona on Sunday, May 15th. These students will also be doing the Living Stations on Wednesday, April 13th at 6:30 pm. Everyone from the parish community is invited to attend.

At all levels, the catechists continue to talk with the students about RESPECT; respect for the teachers, each other, themselves, and the church property.

I would like to thank the church community for the continued support and prayers for our program. We are truly blessed to have so many of our students attending classes, the catechists to teach, and the time throughout the day to hold our classes.
