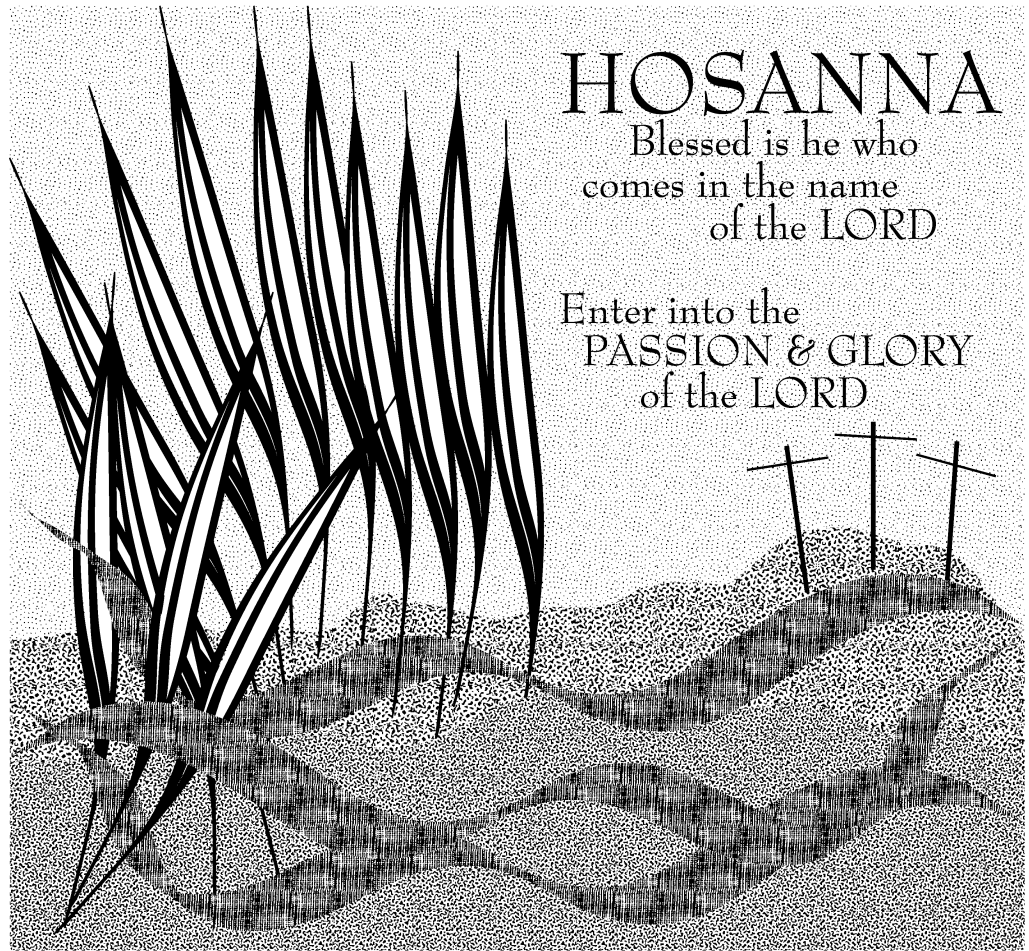

TV Mass Schedule Changes: In an effort to cut costs and expand viewing options, beginning **April 5**, the weekly televised Mass will be switching station affiliates. The new broadcast schedule is as follows:

- ❖ Channel 3 KIMT, Sunday at 7:30 a.m., and MyTV 3.2 at 9:00 a.m.
- ❖ Channel 25 WLAX, Sunday at 7:30 a.m. The TV Mass can also be watched online anytime at www.dowr.org.

as you did at the wedding in Cana.

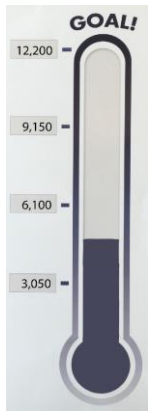
Pray for us, loving Mother,

help them to trust.

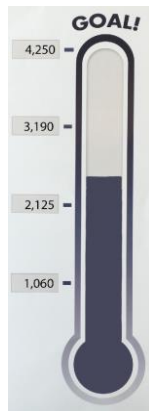
In this time of trial and testing,

Mini Story: Mark Engesser – Lay Formation



I sat in this church for 15 years, feeling like God was nagging me: I needed to do more. I finally listened to the call and joined the Lay Formation class with Todd Graff. After I finished the program, I set up bible studies in my cluster parish. At first, I only got 2 or 3 phone calls, then 15 people showed up at the first meeting. In 2016, we had close to 50 people and 5 facilitators, and the groups have continued since then. I'm happy I took a step out of my comfort zone to grow from this opportunity. What's been great about sharing my faith with others is getting to know people who have a deep faith and who want to build a relationship with each other and with God.

Pastor's Column

There are several items of importance worth mentioning this week. The first is that the Holy Week Liturgies will be available on the diocesan website. I will also be offering the following opportunities for this week:

- Blessed palms are available beginning on Sunday morning at Saint Rose and Saint Anthony. There will likely be plenty to go around so take as much as you like.
- Individual confessions will be available in the Saint Rose Parish at following times: 11-12 on Monday, 12-1 on Tuesday, and 5-6 on Wednesday. I will be sitting in a pew in the Church behind a screen. Penitents will be invited to stand in order to avoid the spread of germs through multiple contacts on the same furniture.
- I will be celebrating all of the Triduum liturgies. Please note that the Good Friday Service and Easter Sunday Mass will be posted on our parish website. Since the Easter Sunday Mass cannot be celebrated on Saturday evening, expect the posting on our website to happen around mid-morning. As is the custom, the Eucharist will be moved from the church to the hall from holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday morning. People are invited to spend time in prayer in the hall and church. The Eucharist will remain in the tabernacle at Saint Anthony of Padua and Immaculate Conception parishes.

The parish telegram chat group is gaining momentum. If you have not signed up, or are having trouble signing up, please click or copy this link <https://t.me/srlpcluster2020>. If you have not already joined Telegram then your smartphone, iPad, or computer will walk you through the steps to do so. When you see the St Rose of Lima Parish Cluster chat group, be sure to press “join” at the bottom of the screen. Some people have asked why Telegram is being used. Once set up, it is easier to use and does not collect information about the user as does many other platforms.

Please notice the new link on the second page of our bulletin and on our website, which makes it possible to provide support to our parishes. Although this is not an easy subject for me to write about, please remember that our bills are not overlooked as well.
