



### **From the Pastor-Month of the Rosary**

October is known in the Catholic world as the Month of the Rosary. Last week, on the 7<sup>th</sup>, we honored Mary as Our Lady of the Rosary. Prayer beads are common across many different religions, and are always meant to lead a person deeper into prayer by repeating a “mantra.” What we repeat are the principal prayers we learned growing up: Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be, Creed (others may be added, but these are the essential prayers). I encourage you to make the rosary a frequent part of your prayer life.

There are two ways to approach the rosary, though it is not an either/or decision. Often, people pray the rosary by repeating the prayers, but not really thinking about them. Rather, your thoughts might turn toward the specific mystery being prayed in each decade (set of ten Hail Mary's). For me, I have a hard time with that. Instead, I use the prayers and mysteries to focus on asking Mary's intercession for a particular request (by the way, asking that Mary care for and watch over you parishioners is a frequent request I pray in the rosary!). I find the rosary to be a great tool for intercessory prayer. I often pray the rosary during my morning walk, or when I'm on the road. We pray the rosary before Sunday Mass, and I encourage you to join in. If you don't have a rosary, don't worry: God gave you ten fingers for a reason (though I'm not sure how the toes fit into this plan...)!
