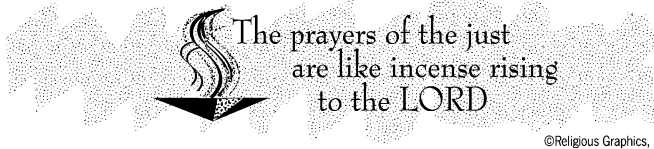

My Dear Parishioners,
"All we can do now is pray." This is said frequently in times of sickness, crisis, or emergency when all human efforts have failed. There's an air of resignation about it, a sense that we are backed into a corner with no way out. It puts God in the place of last resort, and is clearly contrary to the words of scripture and the voice of Jesus himself. In the Gospels, Jesus tells his disciples pray constantly. What does this mean? It means don't wait. Call on God now. Cry to God. Tell God your problems. Open your heart. Even if it seems as if heaven is closed tight, have faith that there is always an ear that hears you and an eye that looks on you with love. Prayer is a way to place every aspect of your life before God. Will all prayer be answered? Yes, but not necessarily in ways you ask for or expect. Like a parent to a child, God in heaven may say "yes," "no," or "wait."

Perhaps your friend who has cancer needs, more than physical healing, to be reconciled with a family member. Maybe the job that fell through for your son would have been a turn in the wrong direction. Your desire to get over the grief of your divorce may be premature. Your children may come back to the Church once they have children of their own. In all these things, God can see the bigger picture. The purpose of prayer is not to persuade God to grant us all that we ask for, but to place our concerns, wishes, and desires in the heart of God and rest them there. God will give us all we need, if we start with folded hands and an attitude of trust. When faced with an emergency or crisis, begin with prayer, such as "Jesus, I trust in you. Guide me to do your will in this and all things."
